ST. PATRICK'S 175 YEARS CELEBRATIONS

We are joyful to inform you that St. Patrick's Church is celebrating the 175th year of its existence, this year. The foundation for the church was laid in July 1841, and the church itself was completed in the next three and a half years, i.e. by the end of 1844. The church was dedicated to the honour of the blessed Trinity, under the name of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Archangel Michael, and was dedicated as the "Church of the Assumption". But even before it was completed, it came to be known as St. Patrick's Church, due to its popularity with Irish troops stationed in the surrounding area.

The parish clergy would love to celebrate this dodransbicentennial anniversary with all of you; and along with the parish council has organized several events between the 7th to the 10th of October -

THE TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS

The Triumph of the Cross, celebrated earlier as the Exaltation of the Cross, is one of the most wonderful realities which encompasses all the mysteries of the Christian Faith, the Justice of God and His Mercy. It reveals God's love for mankind through His son Jesus Christ crucified, and becomes the foundation of our mission and spirituality.

The true Cross of our Lord was discovered in 326 AD by St Helena, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine the Great. Later, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher was built on the site. The feast of the Triumph of the Cross marks the dedication of this church on 14th September 335 AD.

When we look at the Cross as the symbol to transform our lives, it simply means "to follow Jesus". We have a moral duty to make ourselves right with God. The Cross was Christ's atonement for our sins. It symbolizes many things—Victory, Salvation, Triumph over Sin and Death, Hope—but most of all God's love
